TREASURER'S REPORT: Karen Port reported no transactions in 2,000. She handed out the register report for 1/1/99 through 12/31/99; stating our balance for the period at \$3,166.57.

Also note that for an overall award, you need to have competed in a minimum of 15 events and for a category award you need to have competed in a minimum of 5 events. On the final ranking there were people listed with less than the minimum and they cannot receive an award.

REGIONAL EXECUTIVE'S REPORT: George would like to see more governors at our meetings. He asked that the governors in attendance contact the others to encourage them to participate more. Let's support the East Region, after all, we are the largest region in the NCCC. All the meetings will be held at the Old Country Buffet in Mechanicsburg for 2000. He told the governors to invite him to their club meetings to speak about the upcoming convention in 2003.

2003 Convention

A tentative agenda was passed out to those in attendance. Dave Walter visited the convention center in Hagerstown, MD. Thanks for the proposals that you obtained. The information covered everything needed to hold a NCCC Convention. We will have hopefully at the March 18th meeting, information regarding the Baltimore area and the Gaithersburg area. We still need commitment letters from those clubs interested in handling some of the areas of importance on the agenda. They are: budget and computer concerns, door prizes and marketing, security, beverages, vendors, social and entertainment. We also need artwork for logos. If anyone in your club is interested in designing the logo to use at the convention, we will need their ideas by the March 18th Meeting. It should be a 3" x 5" design combining the Convention 2003 with the ER mentioned. Designs submitted for presentation should be in color with 30 copies available. The governors attending the June 10th meeting will vote for the best design to be used on and for all things associated with the 2003 Convention. The winner will be offered a \$100 award if their idea is selected. The \$100 award motion was made by Scott Royer and seconded by Roland Driver. All in attendance were in favor.

WEBMASTER: Jeff Port will be our official webmaster. He is currently looking into updating the ER's web page with a professional designer. The new page would allow space for each club to have their own information. Event flyers, car shows, etc. could be listed by each club. No commitment has been made to any one provider. He will keep us updated with the details on this project.

NEW BUSINESS

Fund Raisers – George made the suggestion that we should continue the Funtastic Raffle but sell the tickets at Ocean City and then have the drawing there. The prize would be \$1,000 or an Ocean City weekend package for the following year. Motion to approve selling tickets for the raffle at Ocean City was made by Roland Driver and seconded by Dave Walter. All were in favor.

50/50 Raffle will commence at the next regional meeting. The money will go into the treasury or toward the tip for the waiter/waitress in our meeting room.

NCCC Awareness – George stated that we need to make people aware of the National Council of Corvette Clubs (NCCC). Volunteers are needed for Carlisle to help promote the NCCC at their booth this year. Maybe a local club could help to promote NCCC. Also this booth would be a great place to sell the Funtastic Raffle tickets. If anyone has any volunteers who would be willing to help out this year please let him know. We should also look into the promotion of the NCCC at Ocean City this year.

Just For Fun – George mentioned about an indoor go-cart track in York, PA. He suggested renting it for the day. It would be a great way for clubs to interact together especially during the winter season.

REMINDER: As a condition of having our meetings at the Old Country Buffet, everyone is required to purchase a meal. You are to either have breakfast or lunch, **NOT** both. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

With no further business to be brought before the membership, the meeting was adjourned at 2:30 p.m. The next East Region Meeting will be held at 11:00 a.m., Saturday, March 18, 2000, at the Old Country Buffet in Mechanicsburg, PA.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

REGIONAL MEMBERSHIP DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

George reported that the membership is growing -- 2,185 members (1,500 males; 677 females & 24 lifetime). Inside the competition package is an updated address listing with the email addresses. Please use this listing and keep it for your records.

Lancaster County is still the largest Corvette Club in the nation. The "Desert" club is catching up fast. George asked the governors to encourage their clubs to sign up new members. Everyone likes a "social" and as you well know -- Corvette owners love to eat

REGIONAL COMPETITION DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Brian handed out competition/calendar booklets. Those not in attendance will receive theirs in the mail. The booklets include a brief summary, the updated competition calendar, report deadlines, an overview and corrections to the event listing, trophy fund report and summaries of the point standings. Great Job Brian and George -- thank you.

FLYERS -- please make sure you mail them to Karen Port **NOT** Brian Gallagher. This delays getting them to the membership if sent to Brian.

Cancellations of events -- Let Brian know ASAP. If you cancel the date early enough another club would be able to use that date. Also, if an event is rained out and is not held, let him know immediately.

Paperwork -- WATCH using "nicknames" for entrants in your events. We need them to use proper names for credit to be given to them. Governors, you are responsible for making sure your result forms are completed properly. Thank you for your cooperation.

REMINDER: Sign the waiver. Due to penmanship of some people and their signing their name where it says "Print Name", please tell them to add their NCCC number under the "duties" column to help Brian know who attended the event if their name is not legible.

Any questions please contact Brian.

Last but not least, **please watch your deadlines**. Forms are being submitted to him late and information is missing from the summary results. This causes him not to meet the deadlines for national.

The following calendar additions:

CPCC September 23rd Gimmick Rallye and Poker Rallye E-100 and E101

Brian handed out the new "yellow" cards for the High Speed Licenses. Governors make sure you have surveyed your members to make sure they are all licensed before attending an event. The white cards will also be acceptable until 2003. Brian is now keeping a database on those members with these licenses. In order to obtain a high-speed license you must have participated in 10 low speed events to qualify or attendance at a driver's school. Members who attended the driver's school at Pocono should contact Dave Walter from CVCC. Event results are your proof to obtain the high-speed license.

REGIONAL EXECUTIVE'S REPORT:

George attended the national meeting and it was mentioned that the membership packets would now be mailed out first class. Hopefully you will receive them by early January instead of March.

Anyone interested in being the editor of Blue Bars should write to the President of the NCCC as soon as possible. The editor, Loretta Spinrad has resigned and a new one is needed.

2000 Convention -- Michigan has received 300 entrants. It's not a good response for a successful convention. Debbie Lindsay has raised \$60,000 in sponsoring money but there is no support from the membership.

Next year the NCCC National Governor meetings will be held in St. Louis, Missouri. Everyone is looking forward to the change in location. We encourage all the governors to attend a meeting to see how the NCCC business is conducted. Let one of your ER officers know if you are interested in attending the September or November meetings in Louisville, KY.

2003 Convention -- Dave Walter passed out a letter and hotel information received from the Ramada Convention Center in Hagerstown. Baltimore is going to cost too much to go there. Hunt Valley does not seem interested. A discussion followed regarding the benefits of going to Hagerstown (perks offered, parking for trailers, side trips, etc.). It was suggested going there for our October meeting in order for all the governors to look over the site. He'd like to check out a site in Frederick. Dave offered to contact the Ramada to set up a time and date in October for the governors meeting.

Central PA Corvette Club has signed up for the Funkhana. We still need clubs to sign up for entertainment/parties, social events (golf, shopping, tours), Corvette Mall

(vendors), beverage chairperson, security, youth program and computer operations (Mike Lindsey). We also need a PR person for contacting the local merchants for money, gifts, prizes, etc. for the convention.

Logo Competition for Convention - Samples of what was submitted were passed around to the governors in attendance. One particular design, submitted by Brian Gallagher, was immediately decided on with noted changes to the artwork. A vote will be held at the August meeting to accept this design submitted by Brian. All present were in favor of this design with the necessary artwork changes. George Gallant suggested that we ought to have hats made up with the design to start wearing them in order to get the word out that the ER will be holding the 2003 Convention. More at the August meeting.

We need the governors to go back to their clubs and get a feeling as to who would support an East Region Convention. Send out info and see what type of feedback you receive and report it back to us. We need your support and that of your membership. It will take 600 - 700 people to make this a successful convention.

If you have an officer that would like to attend the ER Governors meeting in October, let George Gallant know and he'll make the necessary reservations. They also need to get involved to see what will be happening. Chevrolet is planning a lot of parties and celebrations during 2003. It will be a benefit for us to take advantage of the hype that year and draw the interest to our convention it leads up to Corvettes at Carlisle.

Bill Trethaway suggested we should get a flyer prepared for the Ocean City weekend and hand it out announcing our plans. It was mentioned to go ahead and make the Ramada Convention Center our place to hold the convention. Dave Walter made a motion that George should commit to the Ramada Convention Center, George Fanucci seconded. All present in favor, motion passed.

George wants to have hats designed for us to wear with the 2003 Convention logo starting at Ocean City. It was suggested that we vote on the logo at this meeting and that August would be too late to decide. The previous notes stated that the logo needed some graphic changes. We worked the design detail and made the necessary changes. Please plan on attending the August meeting to vote on the design. Roland Driver mentioned that we had stated in a previous Governor's meeting that the voting for the convention logo would be in August. George felt that since this logo is what we were looking for and everyone agreed he would contact someone regarding the cost of having the hats designed and ordered. If anyone has any designs to submit for the 2003 Convention, please have copies ready for all the governors at that meeting to be examined. Voting will take place at the August meeting. Please try and attend that meeting. This is your convention and your input is very important. Colors were also discussed. Remember that the design will be used on clothing, flyers, etc.

Jeff Port suggested a tag line should be used such as "Where It All Began". A sample will be designed with this tag line. It will be ready for the August meeting. If you have any other ideas for a tag line, contact Jeff Port at zanimul@home.com.

Fund Raisers -- Funtastic Raffle is here again. Take some tickets to sell to your club members. You can win a weekend for two at Ocean City, Maryland 2001 plus \$500 or

George handed out the information sign-up sheet to each governor. We would like 2 members per club to volunteer. The times are from: 8:00 a.m. - 11:00 a.m.; 11:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. and 2:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m. each day. Please email George or call him with your list of volunteers. A free shirt is available for each volunteer. Please provide the shirt size of the people volunteering. We need to get the word out there on the benefits of being a member of the NCCC. Help us if you. Sign up as many people as you can. (NOTE: George is out of town from July 7th - July 18th).
