APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES

Michele Cantelmo had distributed the minutes from the May 31, 2025 meeting via email to East Region Governors and Officers. Michele asked for any additions/deletions/changes to the meeting minutes. Motion was made to accept the May meeting minutes by Carl Smith, second by Don Emmons, all in favor, no one opposed.

APPROVAL OF TREASURER'S REPORT

- Michael Woods reported the net worth of the East Region is \$27,028.40. The savings account balance is \$24,432.88. The checking account balance is \$2,595.52. Motion was made to accept the Treasurer's Report by Rocky and seconded by ?, all in favor, no one opposed.
- The 2025 Budget verses Actual was reviewed. Michele will get in touch with Mike to go over the information for the ER Weekend in May. When rectified, Mike will forward an updated copy of the Actual verses Budget.

RE COMMENTS:

- Standing rule changes are on hold until the committee hears back from the E-Board.
- FCOA has a new website. You can get to it by clicking on FCOA on the ER website. There is also an FCOA store.
- Andy mentioned Jon Borcik will be the editor of the ER Newsletter. All articles are to be sent to Jon. It was decided Jon should have the articles by the 10th of every month for the preceding month. It was also decided the email should be sent out only once.
- Increase in dues was voted on and passed at the St. Louis meeting.
- Andy mentioned there are 21 sanctions Thanksgiving weekend in Michigan. ER members need to pay attention to the National Competition and Event Reports. There was a discussion about possibly ER do another weekend of Funkhana's. Possibly doing 7 Funkhana's after the December meeting. Andy would have to speak to the Hotel.
- Andy mentioned NCRS is interested in coming to one of our meetings and we were invited to attend one of their meetings. Andy asked for a show of hands if we should invited them to one of our meetings. By show of hands, there was no interest.
- Andy mentioned the NCM will be changing the NCCC display.
- Andy asked if ER should have another ER Weekend end of May 2026. Carl mentioned Morgantown is too far and members informed him they were not in favor for a 2 day event. He asked if we can possibly go back to one day at the Grantville location. Michele did some research and shared the number of attendees to the two day event verses the one day. It was reminded to all that the ER Weekend is to generate money for the region, not for point chasers. If you do one day, it will be less expensive for the member to attend. Again, it was mentioned the major point is to raise money for ER. It was asked to make the car show a Regional event and the Funkhana's a National event. John was asked for him to check this out with Renee, VP of Comp. if this can be done.

RCD REPORT:

John Reviewed the following:

- John sent out the RMD meeting minutes from Rene with additional notes and rulebook changes.
- There are NO rain dates when holding a sanctioned event.
- Members of a host club holding a car show should not compete with visiting members.
- Member names must match exactly as they appear in the database.
- Pay attention to spaces, commas, and case sensitivity. These details matter in the system.
- Be sure event location address is correct. An incorrect address will affect travel points.
- Results must include a chair, co-chair or worker. If using borrowed sanctions, you may list a member from your club as the chair with zero points or you may list workers with points.

- Review how to properly use a classification sheet for Concours. Encourage judges to treat exhibitors with respect and offer encouragement.
- Be honest with points. They are your points. Keep track of them carefully.
- Ensure that every attendee at your event is listed in the summary results.
- Renee has created many sub meetings, which is being held via ZOOM.
- John suggested all members should keep a copy of the protest form in your car in case you are not happy at an event.
- Michigan Region is having a 3 day non speed 21 events Thanksgiving weekend.

RMD

- Scott reported that as of this meeting there are 2164 ER members.
- There are 233 clubs with 17,464 members.
- Walt wants to create a map where clubs are located. Please review your club information in the database to be sure it is correct.
- Database is now open for renewals. Scott is requesting ER renewals to be processed by 12/1/25.
- Scott needs to know if members wish to keep the plastic cards or go with the electronic version. Savings would be around \$20,000.
- Would members like to see the meetings in St. Louis scaled back to 3 meetings a year. The 4th would be by ZOOM or omitted altogether. This should save approximately \$30,000.
- Do we keep the published issue of Blue Bars or just use the online copy through the website. This will save \$10,000 to \$15,000 a year.
- ER has lost one club.
- St.Louis RMD meeting minutes were forwarded to all Governors.
- Scott welcomed new NVCC Governor Frederick Riley. He also thanked Scott Cox for his service.
- Scott thanked everyone for all their work.

DIRECTOR OF SPONSORSHIP/CHARITY REPORT

CHARITY

There were 36 online scholarship applications, with 27 applicants who completed the whole process. All applications received were excellent candidates. The judges had their work cut out to rate the 27 applicants. East Region had the highest number of applications, which was 9. Eight Scholarships were given out this year. Two of the Scholarships were given to 2 ER applicants. Congratulations to Briana Palmieri from PACC and Reagan Flory from PCCC. The 2026 online Scholarship will open 1-1-26 and will close 5-15-26.

Congratulations to Tammy Dewitt who won the St. Jude Raffle for the day at the NCM Motorsports Park, and Al Flanhofer, who won the St. Jude Raffle for the Michelin Tires. There is one more raffle left for the year and will go off at the November Governor meeting in St. Louis. The raffle is for the CarCapsule and the 1995 Corvette Go Cart.

The annual St. Jude Challenge was awarded to Corvette Troy.

The annual Roger Clancy Humanitarian Award was presented to Joan and Dave Heinmann who have given so much of their time and energy to the Charity Committee over the years.

The NCCC Hospitality Tent at Corvettes at Carlisle was busy with many members stopping by to say "Hi" and asking relevant questions about NCCC.
